Asthma Medication Management

- All patients diagnosed with asthma should be classified, and that classification should not change despite response to treatment and remission of symptoms.
- **♣** All patients with moderate to severe asthma should be placed on controller medications.

We are looking for 3 or more controller dispensing events.

Follow the NY State 2008 Clinical Guideline for the Diagnosis, Evaluation, and Management of Adults and Children with Asthma for managing patients with asthma.

Asthma Action Plan

The Asthma Action Plan is the best way to help children and families remember their treatment plan and follow it at home. Using this form can help save lives.

- Complete the Asthma Action Plan and educate patients or significant others on the importance of its use.
- Tractice using the Asthma Action Plan with the patient or significant other.
- **⇒** Set realistic goals with the patient for better asthma care management.
- Tell the family to keep the action plan posted in the same area so it is readily available.
- Tell the family to keep the medication in the one area so it is readily available at all times.
- Advise the patient on the proper usage of peak flow meters.
- Address asthma issues at every visit and review the Asthma Action Plan with patient.
